<b>Provisional Certified Brain Injury Specialist (PCBIS) Certification</b>	Intended on providing in-depth training for those who intend to develop a career working with individuals who have sustained an acquired brain injury. As a PCBIS, pre-professionals can develop a solid foundation in the field of brain injury rehabilitation and services.	Enrollment in a graduate degree program at an accredited university in one of the following areas: Allied Health, Psychology, Pre-Medical, Special Education, Neuroscience, Behavior Analysis.	Meet eligibility requirements, gain application approval, and pass the remote proctored exam (80% or higher).	\$150 for the initial application; includes PCBIS application, the CBIS exam, and one year subscription to the Journal of Head Trauma Rehabilitation. The fee to transition from PCBIS to CBIS within three years is \$100. 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<p><b>Certified Brain Injury Specialist Trainer (CBIST) Certification</b></p>	<p>Certified Brain Injury Specialist Trainers (CBISTs) are approved to provide official ACBIS training to CBIS candidates. CBISTs demonstrate advanced skills in the field of brain injury and maintain their skills through continuing education.</p>	<p>Minimum requirements include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Bachelor’s degree from an accredited four-year institution and</li> <li>• Minimum of five years of experience working with individuals with brain injury.</li> <li>• Each applicant must be a member in good standing within any licensing boards or bodies that oversee his/her profession, if applicable.
