Community Development	Increase access to survivor and caregiver resources and care by identifying gaps in availability and providing sustainable solutions
Fund Development	Make warm introductions to donors and raise funds to strengthen and expand BIAA - TX's mission
Policy & Advocacy	Elevate and champion legislative issues impacting the brain injury community in Texas
Provider Education	Increase providers' brain injury knowledge through BIAA's Academy of Brain Injury Specialists (ACBIS) educational programs

Committee Chairs

- Work collaboratively with BIAA TX Chapter Executive Director to design monthly agenda with goals and deliverables
- Report progress and needs to the full Community Council quarterly

Community Development Committee

- Increase resources by discovering those available and where the gaps exist in the community including support groups, supportive services and all items that improve access to high-quality treatment and care
- Develop innovative pathways to connect communities with relevant brain injury information
- Partner with providers to inspire a comprehensive continuum of care for brain injury survivors and their support networks
- Promote key 3rd party events surrounding important public awareness campaigns
- Serve a two-year commitment

Fund Development Committee

- Raise funds through foundations, government contracts and corporate and individual giving
- Solicit event sponsorships for BIAA TX's annual fundraising event, Luminary of the Year
- Recruit volunteer leaders to assist with execution of fundraising events
- Provide connectivity to speakers, vendors and prospective donors for events
- Engage participation in key 3rd party events surrounding important public awareness campaigns
- Serve a two-year commitment

Policy & Advocacy Committee

- Elevate legislative issues impacting the brain injury community in Texas
- Act as a collective spokesperson to the State on important federal issues as identified by the BIAA Advocacy Committee and Government Affairs team
- Develop statewide policy agenda (with other council leaders)
- Grow "grassroots" and "grass top" support for policy initiatives
- Support and attend policy events including Brain Injury Day at the Capitol (Austin) and BIAA National Conference & Awareness Day (D.C.)
- Serve a two-year commitment

Provider Education Committee

- Collaborate with BIAA staff to recruit potential Academy of Certified Brain Injury Specialists (ACBIS) participants
- Develop innovative pathways to connect communities with relevant brain injury information
- Partner with providers to inspire a comprehensive continuum of care for brain injury survivors and their support networks
- Promote key 3rd party events surrounding important public awareness campaigns
- Serve a two-year commitment
