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As the nation's **foremost voice on brain injury**, BIAA is dedicated to improving the quality of life for individuals affected by brain injury across their lifespan. With **at least 64 million adults** having experienced one or more traumatic brain injuries in their lifetime, and **11.4 million Americans** over the age of 40 living with a TBI related disability, the need for greater awareness, research, and resources is critical.

Current Landscape

Your support of the Brain Injury Association of America has never been more critical in light of recently announced cuts to various Health and Human Services agencies including life-saving and life-changing programs in the CDC's National Center for Injury Prevention and Control, the Administration for Community Living, and National Institute on Disability, Independent Living, and Rehabilitation Research (NIDILRR).

"Cutting these programs will literally roll back decades of progress and harm not only the people that have been injured, but the people that are going to be injured in the future," said Owen Z. Perlman, a physical rehabilitation physician who sits on the BIAA's Board of Directors.

 BIAA offers free educational webinars for survivors and caregivers and oversees the Academy of Certified Brain Injury Specialists (ACBIS), which has trained and certified over 20,000 professionals, thereby improving the standard of care across the country.
- Research Advancement:

The Brain Injury Research Fund supports groundbreaking research to find better treatments and cures for chronic brain injury. With more than **500,000 service members diagnosed with TBI** since 2000 and **1 in 10** children affected annually, the need for increased research is undeniable.

DR. CINDY IVANHOE

Director of the Spasticity and Associated Syndromes of Movement (SPASM) Program at TIRR Memorial Hermann

Dr. Cindy Ivanhoe is a nationally recognized leader in brain injury medicine and spasticity management. She is board-certified in Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation and in Brain Injury Medicine and currently serves as Director of the Spasticity and Associated Syndromes of Movement (SPASM) Program at TIRR Memorial Hermann. She is also a Clinical Professor at McGovern Medical School at The University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston.

A senior fellow of the American Leadership Forum, Dr. Ivanhoe is widely known for her expertise in treating spasticity and its role in functional recovery, as well as the medical complications of brain injury across all severities and causes. Her career spans the full continuum of care, from neurosurgical ICUs to long-term community-based rehabilitation.

She has trained clinicians nationally and internationally and has extensive experience in Intrathecal Baclofen therapy, having served as an investigator on the FDA approval studies, and botulinum toxins. Dr. Ivanhoe is widely published in both peer-reviewed journals and medical textbooks. Through her nonprofit, Ivanhoe Foundation (IF), she supports efforts like ReelAbilities that promote inclusion and opportunity for people with brain injuries and disabilities.

She currently serves on the Board of Directors and Educational Committees of the International Neurotoxin Association and was a founding member and board member of Mentis Neuro Health. She is also a member of the Texas Brain Injury Advisory Council and serves on speakers' bureaus and advisory boards for companies developing therapies for spasticity, dystonia, and upper motor neuron syndromes. Dr. Ivanhoe serves on the board of the Alexander JFS, is a co-chair of ReelAbilities 2026 and will be chairing ReelAbilities 2007, with the Director of the Mayors Office for People with Disabilities.
